Information & Fees

- All students must have a parent/career fill out and sign a application form before starting classes.
- No chewing gum, food or fizzy drinks to be taken into the studio. Water and energy drinks are encouraged.
- It is the Parents responsibility to be aware of DDA's fees and school policies such as watching days, exam dates, when DDA is open & closed. DDA will post all such information on the DDA web site www.dakodasdanceacademy.com as well as sending newsletters home with the students. It is the the parents responsibility to regularly check the website and ensure they are kept informed.
- Regulation uniform must be worn to all classes. For safety reasons, no jewellery is allowed. Hair should be in a bun for all ballet classes 5 years + .
- DDA is not responsible for before of after care of students. Students should arrive 10-15 mins before their class and picked up promptly after.
- Fees are payable per term (or half term by arrangement) and should be paid promptly within three lessons.
- Fees are between £ 6 -£7. 50 per class. The total terms fees will vary slightly each term so we can follow the academic school term.
- Late fees (fees unpaid before the students fourth lesson) are subject to a £ 25 "late fee"
- Only new students may pay for their first lesson as a single class, to ensure they are happy and wish to join the academy.
- A registration fee (non-refundable) of £ 25 per family, per annum, is required at the time of registration.
- Class fees are non-refundable except in cases of injury or extreme circumstances and at the discretion of the director.
- Any classes cancelled by DDA will result in the class fee be refunded in full.
- DDA reserve the right to provide a substitute teacher if the scheduled teacher is unwell or otherwise unable to teach the class.
- RAD Exam regulation wear from Freeds of London and dance merchandise may be purchased at competitive prices from DDA.
- All parents are invited to come, watch and celebrate their children's progress twice a year. At the end of each year in December, and at the end of the academic year in July. Please check the newsletter for each school's exact dates. Outside of these special weeks, we feel the presence of multiple adults creates a distraction by taking attention away from their teacher's instruction.
